

## Eyewitness to History: A Holocaust Survivor Speaks

### **Osi Sladek: A Courageous Escape from Hate**



Osi Sladek was born in Czechoslovakia in 1935. In 1938, Slovakia seceded from Czechoslovakia and became an ally of Nazi Germany. Almost immediately, Jews were subjected to persecution and oppression. As Jews were being rounded up and killed, Osi's family lived in hiding, posing as gentiles.

As the search for Jews intensified, Osi's family ventured into the mountains and lived there with little food and shelter until they were liberated by the Russian army in 1945. In 1949, his family moved to Israel, and eventually, Osi settled in the United States. Now he speaks to schools and organizations to share his story.
